These energy upgrades include LED lighting, HVAC modernization, and and a new building management system to help the city save money, enhance facility comfort, and have better control over power-consuming equipment.

The resulting savings and positive impacts were made possible by leveraging SoCalREN's no-cost project management services, including technical, financing, incentive, and construction assistance throughout the project's timeline.
