Spotlight: City of Stanton



We want to celebrate the accomplishments of one of our newer enrolled agencies, the City of Stanton! The City joined SoCalREN Public Agency Programs just one year ago, but they have already completed an energy efficient street lighting project which replaced over 1,000 streetlights throughout their community. The new LED streetlights provide better visibility and safety for their residents while saving the City over 235,000 kWh in annual energy savings! The City is already onto their next energy efficiency venture: upgrading buildings such as their Civic Center, Sheriff's Department, and Corporate Yard that will bring in an additional estimated annual savings of over 225,000 kWh.

Project Details:

- Over \$33,000 in estimated annual energy bill savings
- Over 235,000 kWh in annual energy savings equivalent to 412,200 miles driven in a year!
- Over \$103,000 SCE utility incentives received
- Over 1,000 street lights replaced
- 10-month project turn around, from project proposal to incentives received

Great job, Stanton, for taking this big step to invest in your community. We are excited to help you continue your sustainability journey!

HVAC Retrofits Can Reduce the Risk of Exposure to Airborne Pathogens

Concerns about the transmission of airborne pathogens are increasing as studies show that respiratory fluids are aerosolized and expelled through coughing, sneezing, talking, singing, or breathing. Building owners can address these concerns by investing in changes to building operations, including HVAC systems, which reduce occupant exposure to airborne pathogens. Ventilation and filtration provided by high-quality heating, ventilating, and air-conditioning systems can reduce the airborne concentrations and risk of transmission from various pathogens. Adequate ventilation is a critical component of design and management practices needed for good indoor air quality (IAQ).

Improved building IAQ can lead to:

- √ Reduced respiratory health effects
- √ Reduced absenteeism
- √ Improved productivity and cognitive ability
- √ Improved occupant comfort

Apply for Clean Transportation Funding from the Sustainable Transportation Equity Project (Applications Due August 31st)

The California Air Resources Board (CARB) invites local government agencies to apply for clean transportation grants for projects that reduce greenhouse gas emissions and meet their communities' needs. Details:

- \$2 million available in planning and capacitybuilding grants to help identify and prepare for a community's transportation needs
- \$20 million available for 1-3 implementation grants to fund clean transportation and supporting projects
- Implementation grant eligible projects include, but are not limited to: zero-emission buses, vanpool services, transit passes, parking management strategies, and outreach campaigns
